A RARE Spotlight on the North County Quilters' Association of Escondido Celebrating their 30th Anniversary!

This month we are highlighting The North County Quilters' Association (NCQA), a group of quilters whose ages span teens to 80 plus. NCQA was the first quilting group to join the RARE Bear Army when the program began earlier this year. Their experience and skills range from beginner to expert. They welcome everyone into their guild - whether one machine quilts, hand quilts or doesn't quilt at all.

The main purpose of the NCQA guild, besides providing fellowship with other quilters, is to raise money for local charities. This year NCQA will be sponsoring Interfaith, the Wounded Warriors Program through Camp Pendleton Marine Base (just north of San Diego in Oceanside California), the Humane Society and Palomar Forensic Unit. Every year each member commits to making at least one crib size quilt from materials supplied by the guild in a kit form. The finished quilts, called <u>Good Cheer Quilts</u>, are then donated to the Interfaith, the Neo-Natal unit of Palomar Hospital, Operation Homefront and others.

Carrie Harrison, President, reports that Guild members even charter busses to attend some of the big quilt shows as a group - The upcoming "Road to California" show in Ontario, CA is a favorite. RARE Science is delighted to have the NCQA as part of the RARE Bear Army!
